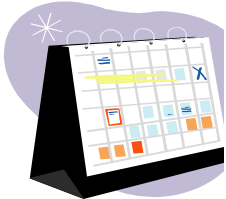

Yuri Mun

Yuri is a junior at Kamiak High School and a member of the Key Club. She has embraced this student-run organization that develops members who become leaders of tomorrow. They have one goal in mind and that is Key Club caring and service.

Yuri has been a great example to her peers with her ability to lead and inspire. Her outreach may have started in Tijuana, Mexico where she traveled with a church youth group to spread her faith and help needy people. As a Key Club member, Yuri has been involved in *Relay for Life*, a fund raiser for the *American Cancer Society*. She helped run the garage sale in 2007 and was instrumental in bringing about a record turnout of Key Club members to volunteer at *Christmas House*. Students put in a six hour shifts to help 362 needy family members, mostly mothers, select gifts for their families. Her efforts included inspiring members to volunteer, contacting parents and school administrators for permission and support. Yuri's efforts resulted in one of the largest number of volunteers Christmas House officials had experienced. Her hard work definitely highlighted Key Club's reputation as dedicated, energetic young volunteers both to Everett's leading citizen/volunteers and those they helped.

Yuri has taken 9 honor classes year to date. She has a 3.4 cumulative GPA with a class standing of 150 in a class of 500. She is a member of the Kamiak High School debate team, participated in numerous tournaments, earning various speaker awards. She posted 300 national points in high school tournaments to qualify for a coveted Kamiak High School letter. Ms. Taylor, Yuri's teacher, who describes herself as Ms. Russell's long term sub in *English III*, second period class, stated: "Yuri is an extremely dedicated student and a hard worker. She has a positive attitude constantly and has a great rapport with her classmates. It is obvious she has a unique and genuine compassion for others as well. The entire AP English class is so happy and proud of her for this achievement. Congratulations Yuri!" Teacher, Heidi Bloemker added: "Yuri is in my *honors chemistry* class. She is really a sweet kid. seeks additional

help, pays attention in class, works well with her peers and tries hard."

Yuri is also is a member of the outstanding Kamiak High School orchestra. *Director of Bands and Orchestra*, Brian Steves reports: "Yuri is a dedicated member of the orchestra.
