“THRIVE” Project

In the next few weeks, you will be receiving an educational kit for the THRIVE program--Tackling the Health Risk of Influenza Through Vaccination and Education. This is a new Young Children: Priority One project for Kiwanis International. This kit contains a guidebook, various brochures, fliers, posters, PowerPoint presentations, PSAs, and a variety of other materials. In addition to these exciting and informative materials, are all the tools needed to promote this very important program. In fact, did you know that:

More than 200,000 people were hospitalized and 36,000 people died from influenza last year (includes 150+ children, over 60 per-

cent of them under age 2, the second highest risk group for complications from influenza).

The US Centers for Disease Control broadened their recommendations for those receiving the flu shot to anyone over age 50 and young children between 6 and 23 months.

Influenza is a threat and Kiwanis is doing something about it.

There are plenty of ways clubs can participate, such as:

Invite a health care expert to speak at a club meeting and highlight the cost of influenza on our community and how important the flu shot is to everyone's health.

Work with your local

health department and conduct a flu vaccination event. Vaccinations should take place between October 23 and December 15 to be fully protected against this season's flu.

Post fliers and distribute brochures (templates are available in the kit) throughout key locations--schools, pharmacies, grocery stores, churches, town halls, etc.--to raise influenza awareness.

This is an easy service project that all clubs can embrace. Not only will Kiwanians be protected, but young children too.
