Our Cub Scout Pack is finally becoming a busy pack with separate den meetings and lot of fun activities. We'll be going on an outing to the Warm Beach Fire Station this month and our Pinewood Derby is Jan. 26. On March 1-2, we'll be going on an overnight adventure at the Pacific Science Center in Seattle.

Everyone is invited to attend our Blue and Gold Dinner on Feb. 25. It is a night to celebrate the birthday of Scouting and present special awards. We'll also be doing a presentation about the Friend of Scouting program. Friends of Scouting provides the much needed funding for the Scouting program to continue. Boy Scouts of America charges each boy \$12 per year to be a member, however the actual cost for each boy is \$134. Because the local United Way agencies will not provide financial support (since we will not remove 'duty to God' from the Promise among other reasons), we rely heavily on this campaign each year to keep the Scouting program running. Donations to 'BSA' are tax deductible, of course. And you even get a special collectable patch depending on the level of your donation. Plus, as an added bonus, the boys in our pack get a discount on their summer day camp - the more the donations, the more the discount.

We are still in need of more leaders (especially a Webelos den leader) and committee members (the organizers behind the scenes) for our group, so if you are interested, please consider it! We meet on Mondays, 6:30-7:30pm at the Stanwood United Methodist Church - you are welcome to come anytime to observe. The Pack Committee meets on a different night (usually a Thursday about once every month or every other month), so if you become a committee member the time commitment is not as great, depending on your assigned task.

We are especially looking for someone interested in planning outdoor activities for the boys - day hikes, an annual pack family overnight, etc. We would like to get the boys doing more outdoor activities throughout the year, especially hiking.
