Board Meeting Highlights

February 28, 2008

Board meeting was held after regular weekly meeting at Stanwood-Camano School District Board Room. President Tom Peiffer presided.

Attendance: Tom, Char, Linda L, Jack P, Mark, Carolyn, Glenda, Bob M, Howard, Darby, Palmer, Linda B.

Darby reported that our finances are in order and Admin Fund is reducing its debt. Four members are still in arrears with their dues. Their dues were paid with the anticipation that these moneys were forthcoming. Dues are due in September. We discussed adding a \$30 late fee which the club is fined by Kiwanis International. Often a company will sponsor a membership, and we may ask that members prepay and then be reimbursed by their sponsor.

Members going to the March 15th Zone Conference paid for their own attendance and lunch registration. The Administration Fund would normally cover that fee and the \$25 needed for the Zone gift basket item. Carolyn Tobiason gave a check to cover that latter expense.

Reading of January Board Meeting minutes were dispensed.

Old Business:

We gave financial help to Roger Cooper who was severely hurt in an accident last year. Tom reported that he is not doing well, and may not survive his injuries.

Mark showed the magazine ad for the Camano Climb, and is already receiving positive responses. Howard, Palmer, and Mark will contact the banks for \$200 sponsorships.

New Business:

Lloy Schaff requested \$50 from Youth Services for School District Kindergarten Reading Readiness Evening. The amount was given.

\$250 was given from Youth Services educational materials for the "Kids in Cars Project," that our Lt. Governor Char takes to the community and schools.

Pacific NW Circle K Groups ask for \$200 to support their school in Africa. The funds will come from Sponsored Youth: Howard made the motion, 2nd by Linda Littlefield, passed.

Community Service will donate \$100 to the Stanwood Lion's Club for their holiday Smoke Stack decorations. Howard made the motion, Mark seconded, passed.

The question of securing product for the August Fair was discussed. Howard, Tom, Kevin, and Basil will investigate the feasible possibilities.

We discussed investing \$250 from the Admin. Fund or general membership to raffle Rose Bowl Parade tickets that support of the Kiwanis International Float entry. The motion was not carried, but more discussion is forth coming.

Jack reminded us that the Rest Stop dates are approaching.

Meeting adjourned.

For the Kids . . .

(from Char's Kitchen)

Easter Nests

Even the adults will enjoy these.
The kids will be proud!

4 cups chow mien noodles
½ cup light corn syrup
½ cup sugar
¾ cup creamy or crunchy peanut butter
jelly beans or other egg shaped candies

In a large mixing bowl, use your hands to break noodles into smaller pieces. In a large saucepan, combine sugar and syrup. Cook over medium heat until sugar is melted and edges begin to bubble. Add peanut butter and stir until smooth. Pour mixture over noodles.

Carefully test for temperature. With slightly buttered hands, form mixture into tight balls using approx. ¼ cup mixture per ball. Make indentation in center of each ball to resemble a bird's nest. Add candy "eggs" to finish the nests. Place on waxed paper and allow to cool completely.

More Great Recipes from Char's Kitchen...

Salads to take along for Easter Brunch:

I have made all of these and the crowds love them!

Sweet Pecan Apple Salad

1 Tbsp brown sugar 2 tsp butter
1/3 cup pecan halves 3 Tbsp oil
5 tsp cider vinegar
1 can sliced beets (drained)
1 medium Golden Delicious apple,
cored & diced

Melt sugar and butter in skillet; add pecans. Cook and stir over low heat 3-4 minutes until caramel colored; cool. Combine oil and vinegar; toss with beets and apple. Add pecans just before serving, and serve over lettuce, if desired.

Cabbage Oriental Salad

1 head cabbage
2 Tbsp sesame seeds
1 pkg Top Ramen (chicken)
1/2 cup oil 3 green onions
3 Tbsp vinegar 1/4 cup sugar
1 cup slivered almonds
1 tsp salt and pepper

Toast seeds and almonds at 350* until brown. Crush noodles into tiny pieces. Slice cabbage, chop onions. Mix well. Mix oil, vinegar, sugar and pour over all ingredients. Add salt and pepper to taste.

Three Bean Salad

1 lb can cut green beans 1 lb can cut wax beans
15 oz can dark red kidney beans 1/2 cup chopped green pepper
1/2 cup sugar 2/3 cup vinegar 1/3 cup salad oil 1 tsp salt 1/4 tsp pepper

Drain all the beans. Add green pepper. Combine sugar, vinegar and salad oil; pour over vegetables. Add salt and pepper; toss. Chill overnight. Before serving, toss to coat beans; drain.

Dessert Salad

1 quart frozen whipped topping
(thawed)
1 pkg pistachio flavored instant
pudding
1 can (20oz) crushed pineapple
(with juice)
1/2 cup miniature marshmallows
(colored)
1/2 cup chopped walnuts
maraschino cherries

Combine all ingredients, except cherries; blending well. Serve immediately or chill. Top with cherries.
