These recipients are models of achievement in standards of excellence.

As shown in the picture on the right, the 6 recipients, their High School principals and their families were hosted at our May 17th meeting by the Scholarship committee of Cliff Bailey and Paul Howe. The students were individually introduced to the club and each gave a short speech thanking the club and informing us of their study plans and their choice of colleges. It was noted that they will actually receive their scholarship when they start school. Next year, we will add an additional scholarship for vocational students and we will remove the Key Club requirement so that students at AIM can be eligible. Tillicum Passes the Hat for Snohomish County Teen

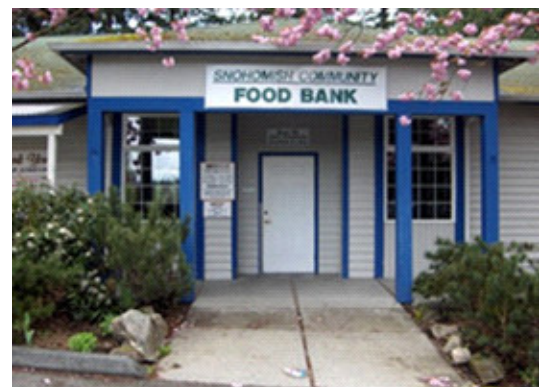

Art Poier raised his hand and told our May 24th meeting about a teen in Everett who needed help. His name is Kyle Ricco who had been homeless and had always dreamed of flying. His father was in jail for abusing him. His mother had battled substance abuse and later died. He finally found safety and support at the Cocoon House, a nonprofit based in Everett that provides shelter, meals and support to homeless teenagers. He would stay at Cocoon House for more than a year, and the Cocoon House counselors report that he thrived. He kept away from drugs, drinking and other trouble that sometimes captures other kids at the shelter. As soon as he turned 16, he got a job and started attending college classes at Everett Community College along with high school. His grades climbed back to A's and B's. He dreamed about college. More than anything he wanted to be a commercial airline pilot. A Cocoon House volunteer became Kyle's mentor and helped him get a driver's license and apply for emancipation, a step that legally made Kyle an adult. He steered Kyle through a maze of applications and tests for college. Kyle was accepted by the University of North Dakota, a school with a well-regarded aviation program. He has applied for every scholarship he can find and Federal loans don't come close to covering the entire cost. His friends have set up a fund "Kyle Ricco Donation Fund" at Wells Fargo Bank to help pay for his educational costs. So it was decided that we would pass the hat to come up with a donation for this young man and when it was tallied the total came to \$270.28. Our secretary then delivered the cash to the local bank to deposit in the fund for Lyle. Thank you, Tillicum! Well done!!

VOLUNTEERS PREP FOOD KITS BOUND FOR SIERRA LEONE

OMAHA, NEBRASKA - Volunteers with the Kiwanis Club of Omaha did a lot of packing on Saturday, all in the name of hungry children.

More than 80 volunteers spent the afternoon at the Omaha Food Bank at 87th and F, preparing more than 17,000 meals. The boxes will be shipped to families in need in Africa's Sierra Leone. The kits contain white rice, soy, a vegetable mix and a vitamin-mineral combination.

"You see all the stories on TV when the kids are going hungry and it's needed, especially in other countries, but also in this country, some places, and we want to make sure that we can do what we're doing," said Lt. Governor Leo Lang of the Kiwanis Club District 20.

Eighty percent of the kits will go to Sierra Leone and 10 percent will remain at the Omaha Food Bank. The other 10 percent is on standby to send overseas when needed.
