Remember, as scary as it may be, the children are the future of the world!

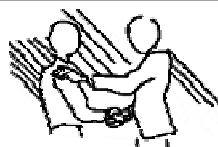

World and National events these past months have caused communities everywhere to re-examine levels of disaster preparation. Our focus will be "Family Preparedness". We plan to distribute American Red Cross information (brochures) on "Building a Family Disaster Kit" while conducting our Food Drive.**
