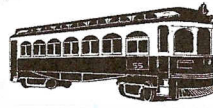

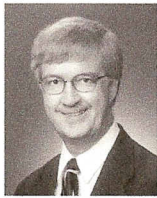

### It's Been Another Great Year for Lynnwood Kiwanis

Hard to believe but the Kiwanis year is coming to an end in just two weeks. Everything is in place for the year ahead. Our new officers have been elected, the Board of Directors are in place. A proposed budget has been approved by this year's Board and ready for the new Board to act upon by October 15. The big Division 22 Installation Banquet (and Monroe 80th birthday celebration) is set for October 17. So, before we jump into the new year let's take a look at what we have accomplished this past year..

- Based on time spent by members and funds raised, the big event of the year has to be the Lynnwood Kiwanis Foundation Auction. The net proceeds exceeded \$32,000 and a big thanks goes out to Chairman John Baker and all of those who made this event a great success. In other fund raising efforts our Annual Golf Tournament netted \$2268.
- Community support would be next in our list of successes. We were able to donate \$8000 towards a new playground at Terrace Park Elementary. We supported Lynnwood Food Bank with our annual food drive and \$4000. Mountlake Terrace Food Bank received \$2000. Every 10th grade student in Edmonds School District was given a dictionary. We supported Lynnwood Fire Department, Relay for Life (a pancake breakfast and funds). We purchased and donated child car seats to Stevens Hospital to assist those who could not afford a safe car seat to take their new baby home. We supported Clothes for Kids with a donation of \$1500. We assisted with the purchase of middle school athletic gear and jackets for Mountlake Terrace Football. We donated \$500 each to Special Olympics, Young Life and Run to Win and for homeless/abused children. We contributed \$8000 in scholarships to Edmonds School District graduating seniors. Most recently we donated \$500 to the SIGN project..

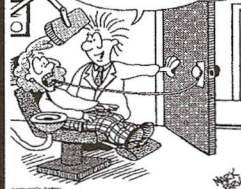
